

Pastor's Message

February is an interesting month, a mere 28 (sometimes 29) days long but yet full of an abundance of noteworthy holidays: Groundhog Day, Valentine's Day, and Presidents Day. (I remember, as a child, before Lincoln's Birthday and Washington's Birthday were combined into one holiday called Presidents Day, February meant two days off from school.) February also includes National Dark Chocolate Day (February 1), National Send a Card to a Friend Day (February 7), Take Your Child to the Library Day (first Saturday), National Pizza Day (February 8), National Clean Out Your Computer Day (second Monday), Get Out Your Guitar Day (February 11), Susan B. Anthony Day (February 15), and National Sticky Bun Day (February 21), among others. February is Black History Month as well.

On the church calendar February 2 is the Presentation of Our Lord, when Mary and Joseph presented the baby Jesus in the Temple at Jerusalem (Luke 2:22-38). The day is also known as Candlemas, after the medieval European custom of blessing candles for use, both at church and at home, during the coming year. Forty days after Christmas, Candlemas marks the end of the Christmas season. Among February's commemorations is Martin Luther who died on February 18 in

1546. Often Lent begins in the month of February but not this year. Ash Wednesday in 2025 is March 5.

Locally, February 2 is the date of St. Peter's annual congregational meeting. We hope that you are planning to attend. The meeting begins right after the morning worship service.

On a personal note, my wife Serena Sellers will be installed as pastor of St. Mark's, Pennsburg, on February 2 at 2:00 p.m. You are welcome to attend!

Though it is still winter, February has much that is happening. God's Word is proclaimed and God's people gather in worship. The mission and ministry that has been entrusted to this congregation and to me continues to be fulfilled. We have much in which to rejoice! Thanks be to God.

Join Us for an Adult Study on Bonhoeffer

This year marks the 80th anniversary of the martyrdom of German Lutheran pastor and theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer. Though Bonhoeffer is often cited in sermons and articles, not many know a whole lot about his life and teachings. Through an offering for congregations, the Lutheran Advocacy Ministry of Pennsylvania (LAMPa) and the International Bonhoeffer Society (English Language Section) is providing a four-session curriculum entitled *Lessons from Dietrich Bonhoeffer in a House Divided and a World on Fire.*

We invite you to join us at St. Peter's for coffee hour and then an exploration of Bonhoeffer's life and teachings. The curriculum is largely interactive and provides significant opportunities for discussion. We will be holding sessions for adult study on Sundays, February 16, March 9 and 23, and April 6, following the worship service, roughly from 10:30 to 11:30 a.m. See you then.
