This year March completes Lent, moves us through Palm Sunday and Holy Week, and finishes with Easter. Whew! That's a lot of ground to cover. I especially invite you to join us in worship during this most holy and blessed time.

The consideration of Jesus' passion and death at this time of the year often leaves us feeling uncomfortable, and rightly so. Jesus' passion and death exposes a darker side of human existence and brings to the surface aspects of our lives that many times we would prefer to avoid; for example, the things that frighten us, our vulnerabilities and failings, the complicated web of sin in which we find ourselves, the desperation that we

feel when we are in too deep and unable to find our way out, and so on.

Yet, we know the end of the story; that is, Jesus' story! Jesus ultimately defeats the forces that hung him on a cross by rising from the dead. His story then becomes our story. In his early morning Easter appearances, the risen Christ assured Mary Magdalene and the other women, and then his disciples, that his resurrection was no mere figment of their imaginations. Jesus is alive and, because Jesus lives, we live. In his rising, Jesus does not deny the suffering of his people but transforms and blesses it. The darker side of human existence gives way to the brilliant, life-giving, and life-affirming light that only the risen Christ can bring. Because nothing was able to hold Jesus back, nothing holds us back.

May God's grace surround us and bring us peace as we journey in March from Lent to Easter! Pastor Raymond Miller
